



## **Resolution on the crisis in Moldova**

*Introduced by NG PPCD, Moldova*

We, the Youth of the European People's Party express our deepest concern that:

A. The Communist Party of Government coming to power, in 2001, began the restriction of democratic liberties and established a totalitarian regime in this country. The democratic institutions have been suppressed through the changes in the legislation and abusive practices, through the infringement of the country's international commitments and stipulations of the Constitution regarding human rights.

B. The Communist Party continue to ignore all the European Institution's recommendation regarding the functioning of the democratic institutions in the country.

C. Through its rule the Government aims to reestablish the soviet model of the social organization, through the sanction of the different opinions from those of the power and through the transformation of the order forces into tools of political repression.

D. The Communists authorities after peaceful protests meetings organized by the CDPP against the military Russian occupation have sanctioned hundreds of protestors and withdrew the parliamentary immunity of 4 CDPP MPs in order to be prosecuted in administrative and penal cases. Thus aiming to arrest the leaders of Opposition and to prevent their participation in the parliamentary elections of February 2005.

Therefore

- express our deep solidarity with the CDPP and its youth organization "Noua Generatie" for their struggle for democracy and European perspective of their country;

- urge the communist authorities and the president Vladimir Voronin to stop all the repressive measures upon the CDPP leaders, to abandon the idea of prosecuting Iurie Rosca, Vlad Cubreacov and Stefan Secareanu, in penal cases and to choose a democratic path of governing;

- call the EPP-ED group to intervene and support this claim in the European Parliament and other relevant EU bodies.
