

Resolution

<u>'External Border Control – A Need for Area of Freedom, Security and</u> Justice'

Acknowledging that:

- Effective external border control is a necessity of any area of freedom, security and justice;
- Efficient external border control is vital in combating drug smuggling, human trafficking and illegal migration;
- Trade-marks, designs and intellectual property act as important legal safeguard for the protection of producer's rights and quality control;
- Smuggling and contravention of customs regulations undermines the financial stability of certain countries;
- Siphoning VAT is a direct threat to the states' national security and finances organized crime.
- The Resolution passed by the YEPP Council in Cork, March 2008, on the Fight Against Corruption.

Considering that:

- The political will of governments is to prioritize the fight against organized crime;
- Effective customs control and the fight against organized crime is crucial in the guaranteeing the economic stability of certain countries

YEPP is appealing to EU and the member-states:

• to elaborate and implement more efficient measures for the combating and the coordinating of the fight against smuggling, tax fraud and the importation of counterfeit goods.

- to implement more efficient measures via an improved inter-state cooperation of the equivalent services in the respective countries for the investigation and prevention of VAT-related frauds,
- to envisage necessary and innovative legislative measures and reforms to guarantee a more effective policy to combat smuggling, tax fraud and the import of counterfeit goods by the strengthened of the outer borders of the EU.
- To implement more efficient measures for restricting drug smuggling, human trafficking and illegal migration.

YEPP appeals to the governments of the new EU Member States, forming as they do the outer border of the Community:

- To continue with adequate reforms and with the strengthening of border control in order to make more efficient and effective the combating of smuggling, tax fraud, the importation of counterfeit goods and the priority of restricting drug trafficking, human trafficking and illegal migration;
- The reforms in the security-related services should not be done at any cost, but they should ensure the preservation of the stability of the border control services and their respective personnel;

To restrain any parliamentary or governmental reforms that could restrict or slow-

down the fight against organized crime and elicit smuggling.
