3 **Resolution on the Cross-Border Contamination of the Nistru/Dniester River and**
4 **Moldova's Water Security**

12 **Recognizing:**

- 13 ● Russia's 7 March 2026 strike on the Novodnistrovsk Hydropower Complex in Ukraine,
14 which caused petroleum products to spill into the Nistru/Dniester River and generated a
15 major cross-border environmental risk for the Republic of Moldova; the Moldovan
16 Parliament stated that the discharged volume exceeded 1.5 tons, while later assessments
17 suggested that the real scale may be significantly higher.¹
- 18 ● that the Government of the Republic of Moldova established a 15-day environmental
19 alert for the Dniester River basin starting on 16 March 2026, in order to prevent risks to
20 public health and enable urgent intervention measures.²
- 21 ● that the Nistru/Dniester River is the main source of drinking water for the Republic of
22 Moldova and supplies water to around 80% of the country's population, making any
23 attack with cross-border consequences a direct threat to public health, water security, and
24 national resilience
- 25 ● that the contamination affected water supply security in northern Moldova, including
26 Bălți and other localities, and required emergency intervention, including absorbent
27 barriers, mobile monitoring, and reinforced protection of water intake stations

- 28 ● that Moldova’s Environment Minister stated that the damage amounts to 100 million euro
29 and that the authorities intend to document the environmental losses and seek
30 responsibility from the Russian Federation.

31 **Acknowledging:**

- 32 ● that the contamination of the Nistru/Dniester River following Russia’s attack on civilian
33 infrastructure in Ukraine constitutes a grave case of transboundary environmental harm,
34 with long-term consequences for biodiversity, public health, and water security.
- 35 ● that the Republic of Moldova requested support through the EU Civil Protection
36 Mechanism, and that the European Union rapidly mobilised assistance, including
37 Romanian experts, specialised anti-pollution equipment, and EMSA satellite imagery
38 services.³
- 39 ● that the Moldovan Parliament formally condemned the Russian Federation for the cross-
40 border contamination of the Dniester River and described Russia as directly responsible
41 for the resulting ecological and humanitarian crisis in the Republic of Moldova.
- 42 ● that Moldovan authorities are continuing water-quality monitoring, building reserves of
43 intervention equipment, and preparing stronger emergency-response capacity for similar
44 future incidents.

45 **YEPP calls on:**

- 46 ● the international community to hold the Russian Federation accountable for the cross-
47 border contamination of the Nistru/Dniester River and to support the Republic of
48 Moldova in seeking compensation for the damage caused.
- 49 ● the European Union and its Member States to support the documentation of the
50 Nistru/Dniester pollution crisis as a relevant case of severe environmental harm caused
51 during armed conflict, contributing to ongoing international discussions on ecocide and
52 environmental accountability.
- 53 ● the European Union and its Member States to continue and expand emergency and
54 technical support for the Republic of Moldova in responding to pollution crises affecting
55 the Nistru/Dniester River, including through the EU Civil Protection Mechanism and
56 related resilience instruments.

- 57 ● the European Union, its Member States, and the Republic of Moldova to strengthen
58 backup water-supply connections and emergency water-sharing mechanisms, especially
59 in border regions, in order to improve resilience during future contamination crises.
- 60 ● the European Commission and relevant European agencies to support Moldova with
61 expertise for water-quality monitoring, environmental damage assessment, medium- and
62 long-term ecological impact analysis, and emergency preparedness for future cross-
63 border pollution incidents.
- 64 ● the Government of the Republic of Moldova to continue documenting the full scale of the
65 environmental and public-service damage caused by this crisis and to pursue all
66 appropriate legal and diplomatic steps, in accordance with international law, in order to
67 defend the rights and interests of the Republic of Moldova.
- 68 ● Moldova’s international partners to support long-term restoration and resilience efforts in
69 the Dniester basin, including improved intervention capacity, strategic equipment
70 reserves, and preventive measures against future spillover effects of Russia’s war against
71 Ukraine.
